

STAGE 4. Battle of the Alamo

STAGE 5 BATTLE OF SAN JACINTO



SCENARIO: (21 April 1836) At dawn, the main forces of the Texas army, totaling about 750 men, faced over 1500 of the enemy. When Houston's long awaited order to advance was given, the Texans did not hesitate. When within seventy yards the word "fire" was given, the Texan shouts of "Remember the Alamo" and "Remember Goliad" rang along the entire line.

SET UP: Rifle targets at 20-25 yards. Pistol targets at 8-10 yards.

AMMO:

- PISTOLS 10
- RIFLE 9

WEAPONS STAGED:

- Pistols Holstered
- Rifle in hand at cowboy port arms

STARTING POSITION: Standing near the tree facing downrange, with rifle in hand at cowboy port arms.

AT THE BUZZER: Yell, "Remember The Alamo!" NEVADA SWEEP the Rifle Targets in either direction. Ground Rifle safely in a corner. Move to railing, Draw 1st Pistol and SWEEP the 5 pistol targets from either direction. Holster. Draw 2nd Pistol and SWEEP the Pistol Targets in opposite direction. Holster. This is a "Gunfighter Friendly" stage. Gunfighters may change leads as long as no more than two consecutive shots are fired with either pistol, and the targets are engaged in accordance with stage instructions. Each target not engaged with the specific firearm required by stage instructions will be scored as a miss.

PROCEDURALS & SCORING

+10 Second Penalty for failure to comply with scenario instructions as written. Each target not engaged
