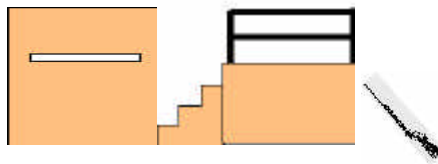


# STAGE 3 BATTLE OF VELASCO



**SCENARIO:** (26 June 1832) In an armed prelude to the Texas Revolution, the Battle of Velasco marked the first bloodshed in the then deteriorating relations between Texas and Mexico. In the conflict, the Mexican commander in charge of a fort at Velasco, attempted to block the Texans from transporting a cannon to use against Mexican forces at nearby Anahuac.

**SET-UP** Rifle targets at 30-35 yards. Pistol targets at 8-10 yards. Shotgun targets at 10 yards.

## **AMMO**

- **SHOTGUN** 6
- **PISTOL** 5
- **RIFLE** 10

## **WEAPONS STAGED**

- Shotgun leaning safely on porch.
- Pistols Holstered.
- Rifle leaning safely against wall

**STARTING POSITION:** Cabin door is closed. Standing and looking out the window with rifle leaning against wall

**AT THE BUZZER: Yell: "Save the cannon!"** Pick up the rifle and SWEEP the rifle targets twice in either direction through the window. Place the rifle safely back in the rack, move to the other window. Draw your pistol and NEVADA SWEEP pistol targets in either direction. . Open the door, retrieve shotgun, and holding the door open, SWEEP shotgun targets three times to end the stage.

## **PROCEDURALS & SCORING**

+10 Second Penalty for failure to comply with scenario instructions as written. Each target not engaged with the specific firearm required by stage instructions will be scored as a miss.
