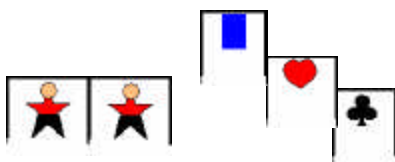


# STAGE 4: THE BATTLE OF THE ALAMO



**SCENARIO:** (6 March 1836) Some 189 Texans in the area took refuge in The Alamo, under the joint command of William B. Travis (for the regular army) and Jim Bowie (for the volunteers). The siege ended on that morning when the Mexicans stormed the Alamo fortress. Losses have been placed at 189 Texans against about 1600 for the Mexicans.

**SET UP:** Rifle targets at 25-35 yards. Pistol targets at 8 - 10 yards. Shotgun targets at 10 yards.

## AMMO

- **SHOTGUN**            **6**
- **PISTOLS**            **10**
- **RIFLE**                **9**

## WEAPONS STAGED

- Shotgun near south end of fort wall leaning against wall
- Pistols holstered
- Rifle in hand at cowboy port arms

**STARTING POSITION** Standing on the scaffold with rifle in hand

**AT THE BUZZER:** Yell: "**Look At All Them Mexicans!**" NEVADA SWEEP the 5 rifle targets with 9 rounds in either direction. Lean the rifle against the rail and descend the steps. Firing through the port,, draw first pistol and SWEEP the pistol targets, Holster. Draw 2nd Pistol and SWEEP the pistol targets through the port also. This is a gunfighter friendly stage. Gunfighters may change leads as long as no more than two consecutive shots are fired with either pistol and the targets are engaged in accordance with stage instructions. Move to the end of the scaffold, retrieve shotgun and SWEEP the shotgun targets without double tapping twice in either direction to end the stage.

## PROCEDURALS & SCORING

+10 Second Penalty for failure to comply with scenario instructions as written. Each target not engaged with the specific firearm required by stage instructions will be scored as a miss.
