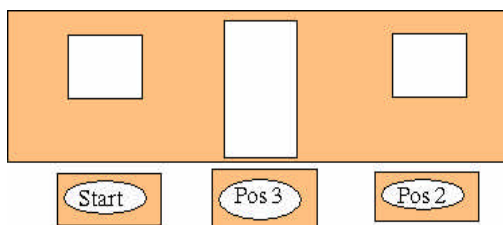
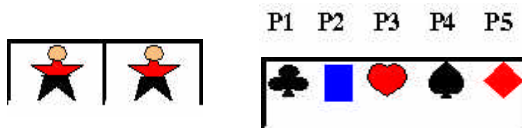
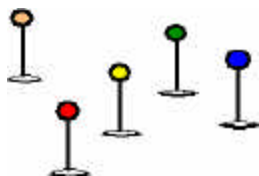


# STAGE 2 THE GRASS FIGHT



**SCENARIO:** (28 November 1835) Toward the end of November 1835, it was reported to the Texans around San Antonio that a shipment of silver was coming from Mexico. A group under Jim Bowie was first to intercept the mule train and a skirmish began. However, the Texans soon found that the packs were filled with grass, rather than the expected silver - the Mexicans had gone out to gather grass to feed their horses.

**SET-UP:** Rifle targets at 15-25 yards. Shotgun and Pistol targets at 8-10 yards.

## AMMO

- **SHOTGUN**            **4**
- **PISTOL**                **10**
- **RIFLE**                 **8**

## WEAPONS STAGED

- Shotgun lying in wagon.
- Pistols Holstered.
- Rifle in hand at cowboy port arms.

**STARTING POSITION:** (to include placement of hands) Standing beside the wagon with rifle in hand at cowboy port arms, muzzle pointed down range. .

**AT THE BUZZER: Yell: "Where's the Silver !?"** DOUBLE TAP the four Rifle Targets. Put rifle in wagon. Draw 1<sup>st</sup> pistol and ENGAGE (P1) and (P2) by alternating each shot (i.e. P1-P2-P1-P2-P1 ) Move to other side of wagon. Draw 2<sup>nd</sup> Pistol and NEVADA SWEEP pistol targets (P3), (P4) & (P5) in either direction. Grab shotgun, and sweep S1 and S2 twice to end the stage.

## PROCEDURALS & SCORING

+10 Second Penalty for failure to comply with scenario instructions as written. Each target not engaged with the specific firearm required by stage instructions will be scored as a miss.
